INVESTMENT IN ROADS

Local residents across Havering are to benefit from a huge roads and pavements investment programme within the Borough.

This year, £10 million is to be spent on upgrading roads and pavements across Havering, your councillors were able get the council to resurface Great Nelmes Chase as a result. The opposition, a certain Upminster Councillor in particular, has always claimed to have got things done, but this is what they do best, claiming the credit for other people's hard work and efforts whilst actually doing nothing. Don't be fooled.

Havering has been awarded an extra £850,000 for pothole repairs by the Government, following the recent Budget. In addition your Councillors are pleased to be supporting a mass investment programme of £40 million on the road and pavement network within Havering over the next four years. This will see the backlog of repairs cleared and the delivery of an improved road network.

INVESTING IN STREET CLEANING

Street cleaning machines and street cleaning teams will be seen more often throughout Havering later this year as a result of a £400,000 investment by the council.

The street cleaning frequency on residential streets throughout Havering will be increased from once every three weeks to once every two weeks.

It is part of a number of measures in the Council's budget for the coming financial year, which will deliver improved local services across the Borough. Residents have told us that they expect the Council to deliver high quality local services and ensure our neighbourhoods are clean and well

Our plan to put more bobbies on the beat

Keith Prince AM, our local assembly member, has announced that Sadiq Khan could put nearly 1,400 more police officers on London's streets by cutting waste in City Hall.

The Mayor could free up nearly £83 million to invest in new police officers if the Mayor reduced some of his bloated City Hall budgets down to 2016/17 levels – the year he took office.

Keith said: "Knife crime and violent crime offences have both jumped in London over the last couple of years."

"Instead of taking action, Sadiq Khan has proved time and time again that he has completely the wrong priorities for London."

"He has prioritised waste and spin over investing in new police officers."

Delivering more police to tackle violent crime

Violent crime in London is too high, with too many communities left feeling vulnerable. It is criminals who need to be put under pressure, not our communities.

Shaun Bailey has a plan to put more police on London's streets by rolling back the waste and perks at City Hall and adopting technology in use by other major urban police forces.

In total, the Bailey plan will produce savings of £83 million, with some City Hall budgets returned to 2016/17 levels, and most of the savings used to pay for 1,342 new police officers.

Specific measures include:

- Gradually reducing the GLA staff budget by £19 million to £36 million, which was the 2016/17 level.
- Taking £1.4m out of the external affairs budget.

INVESTING IN HAVERING'S CCTV



Havering Council is taking the lead in tackling anti-social behaviour across the borough.

Your local Conservative councillors are pleased to report that Havering Council is proposing to invest £250,000 in upgrading and renewing the Borough's CCTV system. The Council's CCTV is monitored by staff based at the Council's offices, enabling coordination with the local police and other emergency services. Over the last five years, video footage from the CCTV control centre has been used to help support the work of the police and contributed to criminal convictions.

Bob said "I am pleased that our council is continuing to support the work of the police by investing in CCTV. This highlights that our Council takes a zero tolerance approach to anti-social behaviour."

RESIDENTS CALL FOR RE-THINK OF SCHOOL PLANS



The highly acclaimed secondary school Redden Court is situated on the border of Emerson Park and Harold Wood wards. Planning permission has been sought to expand this popular school.

The plans have included a new artificial playing pitch and floodlighting. It was this part of the scheme that alarmed many residents living around the site. Those nearby feared light and noise nuisance particularly after dark and protested to us and the school. A petition was presented.

After a meeting and re-consideration, the floodlit pitch scheme was withdrawn. New plans to address the school's needs will be the subject of full consultation. Parents of pupils at the school have also been in touch with us emphasising the need to provide adequate facilities for the young people attending the school.

NEW SWIMMING POOL IN HORNCHURCH IS UNDERWAY

The £11.9m investment by Havering Council will replace the existing pool which was built in the 1950s.



Under the Council's contract with its operating partner SLM the project will be self-financing and will not be a burden on council tax payers.

It will join the Sapphire Centre in Romford opened last year which has an ice rink, pool and fitness suites and where attendances have exceeded expectations.

The new Hornchurch centre is scheduled to open next year.
